Imps win on Opening Day in the first 'Bayer Cup'

The Colac Imperials came from behind to win their round one clash in 2011. Adam Harris, who was a legend at the Colac Imperials, took the reigns as coach of Otway Districts and faced his old club in his first game at the helm. The Imps trailed by 14 points at half-time, but kicked six goals to zip in the second half to record a 29-point win.

The game had moments of drama, with the umpire starting play in the second term, but the Demons were still in their huddle. It resulted in the easiest of goals for the Cats. However, the umpire didn't realise the Imps had eight players in the centre square, which technically should have resulted in a free kick to Otway Districts - who still remained in their huddle.

The game was also the first broadcast of the CDFNL on the radio for a number of years. ■

THE RUN HOME

With just four rounds to go, how will the finals shape up? The scene is set for a Round 18 blockbuster at Simpson. Words **MAX BLAKE**.

With just one month to go in the 2022 CDFNL home and away season, we have a very open premiership to be won. The top three looks set, with this weekend's battle between South Colac and Irrewarra-Beeac to potentially decide who will finish second and third, with a small chance of either side finishing on top.

Meanwhile, the Colac Imperials, Simpson and Lorne are all in a three-way battle for the remaining two spots in the top 5. ■



HOW WILL IT END?

ALVIE - 12-2

Final 4 games - Simpson (W), Western Eagles (W), Otway Districts (W), Birregurra (W).

Alvie have run the table, defeating every team this season, but at times they've shown they're beatable. The Swans should win their remaining four games, with the Tigers being their toughest opponent, this weekend. The Swans look set to claim back-to-back minor premierships.

Predicted finish: 1st (16-2)

SOUTH COLAC - 12-2

Final 4 games - Irrewarra-Beeac (L), Lorne (W), Apollo Bay (W), Western Eagles (W).

The Roos are again challenging for another tilt at a flag. This weekend is their biggest test, before entering the finals. If they can defeat the Bombers they're a chance for the minor premiership, should Alvie slip up. But, they are more likely to finish second or third.

Predicted finish: 2nd (14-3-1)

IRRE-BEEAC - 11-2-1

Final 4 games - South Colac (W), Colac Imperials (L), Simpson (W), Otway Districts (W).

The Bombers haven't lost since Round 2, when they slumped to a 0-2 start. Since then, they haven't looked back. They've had a perfect finals preparation, playing some really good sides. There's a chance they may slip up, which won't be the end of the world.

Predicted finish: 3rd (14-3-1)

COLAC IMPERIALS – 9-5

Final 4 games – Otway Districts (W), Irrewarra-Beeac (W), Lorne (L), Apollo Bay (W).

The Imps look set to lock up 4th spot. They just need to win three of the four games. Their percentage is lower than Simpson and Lorne, but if they keep winning they'll make it. They have a couple of tough games, so their destiny is in their own hands. The Cats have shown they are capable of matching it with the best.

Predicted finish: 4th (12-6)

SIMPSON – 8-6

Final 4 games – Alvie (L), Otway Districts (W), Irrewarra-Beeac (L), Lorne (W).

The Tigers have a tough run home, so if they make the finals they will have earned it. A shock win against

one of the top three sides will lock them in, but that seems unlikely. Their Round 18 home game against Lorne looks like an early elimination final match-up.

Predicted finish: 5th (10-8)

LORNE – 7-7

Final 4 games – Birregurra (W), South Colac (L), Colac Imperials (W), Simpson (L).

Lorne's percentage is better than both Colac Imperials and Simpson, so if they can record a surprise win against arch-rival South Colac in Round 16, it will elevate them above Simpson. The blockbuster Round 18 fixture at Simpson will ultimately decide whether the Dolphins will play finals.

Predicted finish: 6th (9-9)

OTWAY DISTRICTS – 4-9-1

Final 4 games – Colac Imperials (L), Simpson (L), Alvie (L), Irrewarra-Beeac (L).

Otway Districts are mathematically still a chance. But, they play four of the five teams in the top 5. To make it they will need to win all four games and rely on Simpson to lose all their remaining four games, along with Lorne to lose three of their four games. It would seem unlikely, and if they do make it, they need to make a movie about it!

Predicted finish: 7th (4-13-1)

DARCY

on the *rise*

Darcy Collins has played over 209 club games at Birregurra through juniors and seniors. He's one of the up and coming guns of the competition. We spoke to him this week. Words - **MAX BLAKE**.



MAX BLAKE: Thanks for chatting to us today Darcy. It's been a tough season this year at Birre, but there are good signs with so many kids getting games into them. How have you rated the year so far?

DARCY COLLINS: Yeah, it's has been tough, we've had older blokes come in and out of the side every week. But, on the plus side it allows us to get plenty of experience into the younger guys coming through. This will only help them develop quicker than they normally might have to.

I probably rate the season pretty tough, whilst we're in a re-building phase we're still trying to compete with the teams at the top, which I think we have managed to do on numerous occasions.

MAX: You're currently leading the club's goal kicking this season, how have you've rated your year on a personal note?

DARCY: I probably wouldn't rate my season as too much of a standout. I'm just trying to play consistent footy. I've been played in a couple of positions this year, so I'm just trying new things and trying to maintain form.

MAX: What's your favourite position to play? It seems like you look pretty settled on the wing.



DARCY: Yeah, I was settled on the wing, until 'Darra' (coach Glen Darroch) suggested I start to roll through the middle for the end of the season - which I'm loving. It's good and I can use my fitness a lot more.

MAX: You've been at senior level for sometime now. Early days, how did you find the transition from juniors to seniors? Was it easy, or did you find it challenging?

DARCY: It definitely wasn't easy. I came through, whilst our seniors

have been as strong as ever. It was a hard side to break into, but it was a challenge I loved. Earning your spot in the team was very rewarding. As for the football, it was just getting use to the bigger bodies and quicker ball movement.

MAX: Who are some of the players you've looked up to in your career? Are there any that you've tried to build your game around?

DARCY: I've always idolised Mick Davis. His skills, leadership and the

type of bloke he is. There's not a bad thing about him - he's the king of Birre.

MAX: When the sad day comes that 'Micky' officially hangs up the boots, would you request the famous number 3?

DARCY: Haha, nah I don't think so! I'm pretty set with number 19, and I don't think I want to change that!

MAX: You've kicked a few ripper goals in your career so far - both juniors and seniors. Do you have a favourite?

DARCY: I'd say a late one to sink South Colac by a couple of points - a couple of years ago. Ash Borch still has nightmares from watching that game.

MAX: Do you have a favourite game you were apart of?

DARCY: Nah, not from memory! If I had to pick one, it would probably just be my first senior game, which was back in 2016 at South Colac.

MAX: Who have been some of your hardest opponents on field, so far in your senior career?

DARCY: Running on the wing, Billy McLeod is always a good challenge.

MAX: Who's the next superstar player at Birre to watch out for?

DARCY: Pauly Doak is one to watch. He cracks in hard and the more football he plays the better he is going to get. I've been watching him closely for awhile, he improves a mile every week.

MAX: What's your favourite away ground to play on and why?

DARCY: Probably Simpson, it's a big oval which allows plenty of run. It also opens the game right up, which means less stoppages and fast flowing footy.

MAX: Four games remaining for the season. What's the aim

for the rest of the year, for yourself and the team?

DARCY: For myself, just working on personal development. To keep learning and trying new things. As a team, just not let the boys' attitude change, because the end is near. Keep doing the right things and keep trying to get a couple more wins, before the season is over. ■

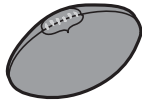

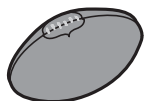
