We have some huge games such as the **Coastal Cup** and the **Cat-Or-Roo Cup**, but we also have some great rivalries built on their past encounters. Here is our *CDFNL Live Rivalry Round* explained.

South Colac v Lorne

These two sides have met in the past four final series, but they also played in our last senior Grand Final in 2019. They've met in seven CDFNL grand finals - 1981, 1982, 1983, 1997, 2001, 2002 and 2019. In 2002, South Colac ended Lorne's amazing CDFNL record-winning streak by upsetting them in the big dance.

Simpson v Otway Districts

Both these clubs joined the CDFNL in 2003, after the Heytesbury Mount Leura League dissolved. Annually, they play for the **Heytesbury Shield**, which results in a combined total of scores between the two clubs across all grades of football and netball played on the day.



Alvie v Western Eagles

The two clubs, west of Colac. The battle of the Pirron Yallock pub? They've exchanged a number of players over the years. Irrewillipie and Alvie have meet in a couple of grand finals.

Colac Imperials v Irrewarra-Beaac

One of many, **Dan Casey Cups**. These two teams have history over the last decade of playing in thrilling games. 10 of their past 15 meetings have been decided by under three goals.

Birregurra v Apollo Bay

Who won't forget their famous drawn final in 2019? These two clubs are building a new tradition - an indigenous game, hosted at Birregurra today. This game could see a great rivalry built over the next few years. Both clubs have had great successful eras, but are both in the re-building zone at the moment, which will see them climb up the ladder together.

FOOTY'S BEST *broadcasters*



Australian football media has been blessed with huge amounts of fantastic commentators. Here are my favourites.

In most interviews I do with CDFNL players, I ask them who they mould their game from - an AFL star or a local league legend? Many look up to a player in their position.

A midfielder might look up to a Patrick Cripps or a Andrew Kelly, or if a forward a Tom Hawkins or a Christian Kelly. It's the same with broadcasters. I get asked a lot by people who I look up to when broadcasting football? Where did my passion come from? Who are my favourites, etc?

When commentating footy, I always added my own flavour to it, as would most commentators, but you do take small ideas from others. I've found as a kid that's where my passion for broadcasting began. So many of my favourite callers came from the late 90s and early 2000s.

Here's my top 10 favourite football commentators of all time. ■

RANKING THE CALLERS

1 - IAN "ROBBO" ROBERTSON

Whenever I listened to Ian's games, it brought back a warm nostalgic feel of where my passion for calling footy grew. Ian's ability to time his excitement at the crucial time of the play made him such a great caller. He never dished out the one liners like Dennis (Cometti) did, but he did deliver a "You Beauty!" at certain stages. He called for Channel Seven and Fox Footy and then finished his calling days on radio, doing Cats games on K-Rock.

2 - DREW MORPHETT

Like Ian, whenever I heard Drew's voice I thought of my childhood footy loving days. He'd call VFL games on the ABC on Saturday arvos, Channel Seven on Saturday night games and was on radio at other times. He was an excellent presenter and he had a fantastic ability to barrack for the great plays and he'd rise to the occasion when needed.

3 - BRUCE McAVANEY OAM

Bruce was "special". However, I do think he was a much better Olympic Games caller. But his knowledge that he brought to his calls was first class. I always thought he must have had a team feeding him the info or stats, but it was just all in his head. He was one of the best preparers for a call I've ever seen. "The moment has arrived" is one line that goes unnoticed. He would only use that line just moments before an AFL Grand Final.

4 - TIM LANE

Despite his one massive calling error, claiming Geelong's era was over during an opening quarter of a game in 2010, when they trailed by only two goals against the Western Bulldogs,

but would later go on to win the game by 100+ points. Whenever I think of Channel Ten's stint of broadcasting AFL (2002-11), I think of Tim. His best work is on ABC radio, though. You knew exactly where the ball was when Tim was calling. He also has a great skill of summing up the game in a sentence, when the siren would sound. His classic line "Vindication has finally arrived." - 2009 Grand Final between St Kilda and Geelong Cats.

5 - ANTHONY HUDSON

He is the best current day AFL caller, but he's had a fantastic career to date. His early days were on Channel Seven, he then crossed over to Channel Ten, Fox Footy and SEN. He's owned some of the great moments in the game. Lance Buddy Franklin's "13! 13! 13!" and unfortunately for Geelong fans, "I see it, but I don't believe it!" He's a mad Geelong supporter and to be able to call *that* moment of Sydney Swans Nick Davis breaking our hearts in the 2005 semi-final, without any sign of showing his blue and white colours was pretty amazing. He has a great ability to make the call entertaining, but still focuses on the game.

6 - DENNIS COMETTI

You might be surprised just how low I have Dennis on my rankings. Yeah, sure he was fantastic and pulled off some of the greatest one liners of all time in football broadcasting. But, I just felt at times his dialogue was a little bit slow for my liking. He was better when he was calling by himself, but when paired with someone else, it was two completely different tones. Dennis was a wonderful presenter/host as well. He was smidge biased towards the WA teams, though.

7 - CLINTON GRYBAS

Unfortunately, we didn't get to hear Clinton at his peak. He was sadly lost

in 2007, but he was on the verge of being one of Australia's best sports presenters. He could call anything! Early days, his calls were nostalgic for me when calling NBL and VFL games on the ABC. His stardom then grew when Fox Footy Channel was launched in 2002. He was the sole caller in that infamous Geelong Cats 157-point victory against Richmond in 2007, in which the Cats kicked 35 goals. A game I love watching over, and over.

8 - SANDY ROBERTS

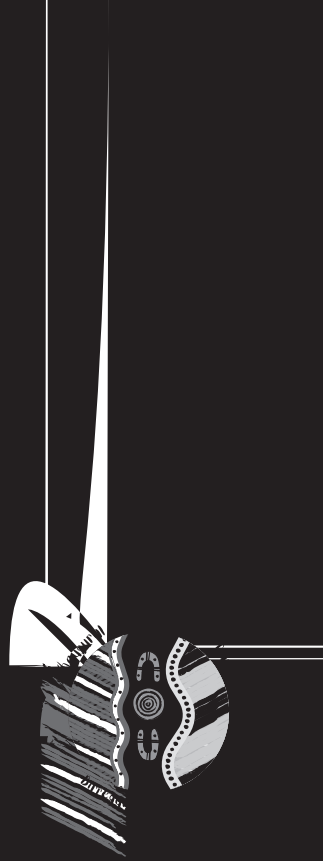
Sandy was just a master class of broadcasting. He was an all rounder, a great caller, great presenter, great interviewer and great journalist. I love how he pronounced things just a little different to others, and stuck by it. The way he would say "Fremantle" still lives rent free in my head.

9 - PETER DAICOS

Peter had a small stint at calling footy from 2002-06 on Channel Ten - mainly doing the Saturday arvo delayed game. I really loved him as a caller and I think we have lost a great play by play caller. He's one of the best footballers I've ever seen play, so his footy IQ is off the charts and his ability to read the game and predict what was coming next was outstanding. He is one I actually moulded my calling around.

10 - WAYNE SCHWASS

Wayne mainly did radio calling on Triple M, but had some small stints on Fox Footy. He was an excellent play by play caller and like all good radio callers, you knew where the ball was when he was calling. He also called the game in a way not many could. He was as critical as what the media are now. He always spoke about the players in a positive way, which I think is probably why he isn't in the broadcasting game anymore.



MAX BLAKE: Thanks for chatting to us today Huddo. It's been a tough season at the 'Bay. How have you rated the year so far?

HUDSON HARRISON: Yeah, it hasn't been the year we were hoping for mate. We've been struggling with numbers for most of the year and to get our best side on the park each week has been hard due to injuries and other circumstances. But, if we take the positives out of it - it's given us the chance for our younger players to develop and get more senior game time under their belts.

MAX: What about your season personally? How have you rated your year?

HUDSON: Yeah, I've just being to play my role each week. I've been playing a couple of different positions in the last few weeks, so I'm just trying a few new things and figure out the best way to impact the game - playing different roles than what I'm used to.

MAX: What position do you like playing?

HUDSON: I like playing across the half-back line. But, I've been moved forward in the last few weeks and yeah, I've been loving it up there, with a bit of a run through the middle, which has been good.

MAX: How'd you go being in the same forward 50 with the great Zaperenkov?

HUDSON: Great mate! It's good to

learn off someone like 'Zap' that's played a lot of great footy during his career, at a good level and just see how he does it up forward. For a bloke that gets out numbered every week, he does a great job.

MAX: You've been at Apollo Bay FNC pretty much your entire life. Who have been some of your favourite players to watch but, also played with?

HUDSON: Yeah mate, I've been at the 'Bay my whole life and been watching footy down here for a long as I can remember. As a junior,

I always looked up to Hamish Tamlin. He was just an absolute bull in the middle when he played at the 'Bay. I admired the way he went about it. As for players I've played along side, Dion Lawson and Brad King are just two great footballers that go about business every week. Their leadership on ground is fantastic.

MAX: What's your favourite away ground and why?

HUDSON: It's hard to go past Lorne's at the moment. The ground is in great condition, great club

rooms and always a great game between the two clubs, when we head around the coast.

MAX: You're part of the new generation of players down at the 'Bay. All the older guys, (your old man, Michael) always talked up the rivalry with Lorne. Is it still there nowadays?

HUDSON: 100 per cent mate! Whenever we play Lorne it's always a great battle between the two sides, with plenty of heat in the game at all times. The older guys around the club still keeps the rivalry going, and I don't think it will go away anytime soon.

MAX: You guys went through something that doesn't normally happen at local level with your coach departing mid-season. How have you found Jarrod (Wight's) transition into the role and what has he brought to the table?

HUDSON: Look it's wasn't great timing, being at the middle of the year, but Jarrod has stood up massively. He's been the senior captain at the 'Bay for a number of years. He's also coached us boys when we played Under 17s, so we all have belief in Jarrod and back him to be the right man to take over from Harley (Soall). We've started playing a different brand of footy and it's showing that when we play the way we want to, we can take match it with some of the top 5 teams.

MAX: Your old man, Michael is a legend at the club and the league. How have you found taking the field with that pressure and creating your own career?

HUDSON: I've found it easy. Dad never pressures me. He always supports me, gives feedback when I ask for it. I'm just creating my own career.

MAX: You guys play at Birregurra this weekend, wearing those awesome indigenous design footy jumpers. What are your goals for the remaining three games this season?

HUDSON: Yeah mate, for the rest of the year we just want to keep developing the younger players in our side to get more confidence playing at senior level and get them ready for next year. We'll also be trying to win the next two out of three games of the remainder of the season.

MAX: 'Chicky' Barber made his return to the field, last weekend

in the twos. Did his performance warrant a senior call up?

HUDSON: He's always entertaining and it's great to see 'Chicky' having a run around in the twos, but one goal not's going be enough. Maybe three or four this week and we'll see what happens.

MAX: What makes Apollo FNC a great club to be apart of?

HUDSON: Everything about it is great! Being a small town, everyone knows everyone. We all get along, it just works well and there are a lot of great people running the club at the moment. For a small town like us, the footy club is a major part of it. It's something that everyone does on a Saturday, if your not playing your spectating. It's just great to be apart of it. ■

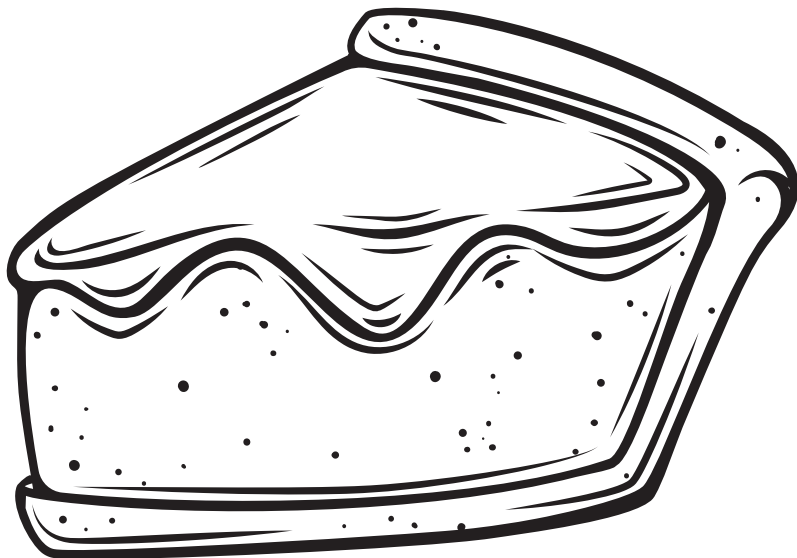

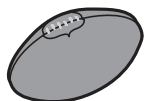
