

Seven days in football

Irrewarra-Beeac produced a barnstorming final quarter in last week's preliminary final to advance to the Grand Final.

BOMBERS IN THE BIG DANCE AFTER FINAL TERM BLITZ

For three quarters of last Saturday's preliminary final between Irrewarra-Beeac and Alvie it was neck and neck.

The **Swans** twice looked like they were going to run away with the match, leading by 20 points in the second. But the **Bombers** kicked the last four goals to snatch the lead at the main break. The Swans built another handy 15-point lead in the third term, only for the Bombers to boot the final three goals, to head into three quarter-time four points up.

The final quarter was all Irrewarra-Beeac. The Bombers went ballistic, booting eight goals to none, storming into the 2022 Grand Final. The final score was 1714 (1)6) to 813 (6))

Charlie Grist kicked five goals, Josh Sanders four, Tom Jackson and Cam Parker kicking two goals each in the final term. Tyler Flanigan, Campbell McCrae, Mitchell Thornton and Jaden Angus were all named in the Bombers' best players.

Dom Dare kicked five goals for Alvie, with Lincoln Dare, Levi Dare, Andre Delorenzo and Sam Vale all named in their best players.

SOUTH COLAC END 22-YEAR DROUGHT

South Colac's 12 O'Clock team (Reserves) has made their first Grand Final in 22 years, after a solid performance against Lorne.

The Roos, who won the minor premiership, lost to the **Swans** the previous week, in the second semi-final, but stormed back onto the winners list last week.

Scores were level at 46 each in the final term, after a three quarter-time malee. The Roos kicked three of the final four goals to book themselves into the Grand Final. Final score was 10.5 (65) to 8.4 (52).

Bailey Lingard kicked three goals for the winners, Zach Downard and Cody Downard chimed in with two each, while Jordan Morrissy, Bailey Lingard, Sam Cass and Luke Burnett were named in the Roos' best plauers.

James Pullen kicked three goals for the Dolphins, with Grady Murnane, Joel Tipping, Steven Oliver and Rob Staley were named in their best players.

The BEST Grand Finals of the past decade

There's been thrillers, blow outs and many highlights during the past decade of Grand Finals. Here's my rankings from a decade of broadcasting CDFNL footy. Words MAX BLAKE.



Irrewarra-Beeac 11.10 (76) d. Birregurra 11.8 (74)

The more I re-watch our CDFNL Grand Finals, the more this one keeps coming back to my mind. Both these two sides had an epic rivalry over a couple of years. They met in two semi-finals and two Grand final.

On this day in 2010, it was neck and neck in the first half, with Irrewarra-Beeac dominating the third quarter to build a 40-point lead in the final term.

Dan Casey had a shot from about 30 metres out, which he missed. This would have put the Bombers seven goals up, with an unassailable lead. But Birregurra were able to turn it around and with just minutes to go saw themselves only two points down.

The final five minutes of this game is some of the toughest you'll ever see in country footy.



2 2011

Birregurra 6.10 (46) d. South Colac 6.7 (43)

The margin in this game never crept over double digits. These two sides slogged it out on a heavy track all afternoon to produce a classic Grand Final.

Just two goals each at half-time, the game slightly opened up in the second half. Micky Davis put Birregurra eight points up the in final term. But, South Colac hit back shortly after. Ben Cox had a snap shot in the forward pocket to put the Roos in front, late in the game, but missed.

In the end the Saints, after two failed Grand Finals attempts in 2009 and 2010, finally broke through and won.





3 2015

Simpson 12.10 (82) d. Irrewarra-Beeac 8.11 (59)

Simpson became the first and only side of the decade to go premiers and champions, but it wasn't on their own terms.

Irrewarra-Beeac became a bit of a Cinderella story, rising from years of finals exile. The Bombers finished fourth and made their way to the big dance.

The game was played in perfect conditions and the Tigers looked in complete control in the third term, after gathering the lead in the second term.

The Bombers fort back, kicking the final four goals to be within just three points at the final break.

Adam Courtney's Tigers rose to the occasion, producing a big final term to storm over the Bombers to seal the premiership win.



Birregurra 11.10 (76) d. South Colac 7.12 (54)

This game was played on a knife's edge all afternoon. The two sides exchanged leads for three quarters, with **Ben Cox** booted his 100th goal of the season, putting the Roos nine points up in the third term. But, from there the Saints clicked into gear.

Matt 'Cherrygurra' Cherry set up all the Saints' goals in the final term as they went on to win the flag.



Lorne 15.11 (101) d. Colac Imperials 11.6 (72)

Ignore the scoreline in this one, as this was probably the highest standard of Grand Finals played in the past decade.

The Imps jumped the Dolphins early and taking a handy lead in the first term, but the Dolphins dominated after quarter time and looked home. But, just before the final change, the Imperials rose again, cutting the margin back to within two goals. However, Lorne's class with Lewie Hollmer kicking five goals ensured they got over the line.



Forrest 7.5 (47) d. Lorne 5.12 (42)

This Grand Final was an absolute grind, played on a very heavy mud track. This game is always hard to go back and watch.

Stoppage central - but with one epic finish. Lorne missed a few easy shots, while Forrest took their opportunities. In the end, the Lions held on in a classic flag win.

7 2014

Simpson 21.13 (139) d. Birregurra 5.6 (36)

It's the biggest Grand Final margin in CDFNL Grand Final history, but Simpson still managed to make this game entertaining to watch... unless you support for Birregurra that is. The Tigers kicked some unbelievable goals that day!

8 2018

Lorne 8.10 (58) d. Birregurra 5.7 (37)

The weather gods were not in our favour on this day in 2018, with it being the one the coldest days of the season, coupled with huge winds.

The game was on even terms at the final change, with Birregurra kicking with the wind in the final term. But, Lorne stepped it up another level, and after suffering a handful of heavy defeats to Birregurra, during the season, they managed to win the one they needed.



9 2017

Birregurra 15.4 (94) d. Lorne 5.7 (37)

Birregurra were home at half-time in this one, and after that, it wasn't a great game to watch. Tom Stephenson produced some great highlights, including a ripping goal to seal the Saints' premiership in the second quarter.

12019

Lorne 10.18 (78) d. South Colac 2.7 (19)

Sadly, we've been holding onto this GF for some years now, as it was the last one played!

Lorne absolutely smashed South Colac from the get-go. The only interest in the game was seeing if the Roos would go goalless. They ended up kicking their first goal at the 15-minute mark of the final guarter!

The Dolphins deserved their premiership, as they were brilliant in very tough conditions.

Forrest

10 years ago, Forrest won an epic Grand Final. Their captain, Sean Calcedo produced a story of his own, we spoke to him this week. Words - MAX BLAKE.

MAX BLAKE: Thanks for chatting to us today, Sean. Can you believe it's been 10 years now since that famous 2012 Forrest premiership?

SEAN CALCEDO: Cheers Maxy! Thanks for having me. Absolutely not mate! The 10 years has flown by.

MAX: Do you guys keep in touch still?

SEAN: Yeah we try to. We had a yearly reunion going for a while there. There seemed to be always one of the boys trying to get everyone together, again. It's obviously our 10 year reunion this year, which is shaping to be a great day. So, it's going to be great to see the boys I haven't seen in a while, and also the people that were involved at the club.

MAX: Has it been harder to stay

connected with the club, since it's been in recess?

SEAN: We tru our best, but the best case scenario would be if the club is still going and we're going to the events like the cash draws and the past plauers daus to see everyone.

MAX: How does it feel that your probably going to be the last ever, Forrest premiership captain?

SEAN: Honestly, that's never crossed my mind. Hopefully, I'm not the last. But. I know that's a tall mountain to climb.

I suppose it's nice, but just to have that opportunity to captain and win a premiership and to have the memories to look back on is great.

MAX: Can uou remember much of the actual season? You guys lost a thrilling elimination final in 2011, then spent most of the following season on top of the ladder.

SEAN: Yeah, I remember that loss in 2011 - it was prettu heartbreaking. It felt like we had the players to really get on a roll and do some damage in finals, but we had a couple injuries and it didn't work out.

In the 2012 season, we'd picked up a handful of players going into pre-season and most of the bous stuck around from the 2011. So. we were looking pretty good.

Dave Mack was great for us as coach, but couldn't commit fullu to 2012, so 'Blissy' took over in pre-season. He probably saw the potential we had. He got a whole coaching team behind him as well as extra trainers and we had great pre-season. Also, having a second year, with the majority of the boys

helped, and it just fed us going into the season.

Like you said Maxy, we were on top for most of the year and finished on top, but still no one really ranted us. But, that was fine, we were confident for that year.

MAX: Lorne rolled you guys by 12 goals in the second semi-final. How did use turn it around? Not only to win the following week, but to beat the Dolphins, two weeks later in the GF?

SEAN: Yeah 12 goals! That was a bit of a shock. I can't really remember the game too much, but we'd beaten them during the year, so we knew we could.

Lorne were a great team, with some great plauer, so heading into finals theu were the team that we thought was most dangerous for us. It was going to take our best to beat them.

Playing Birre, the next week was do or die and luckily we were firing that day and played really well. Again, I can't remember the







game too well, but I remember 'Blissu' during the week telling myself and my bro, Dean that he's going to play us off the half-back. He wanted to tru and get some re-bound and run and with the bigger bodies in the middle, like Adam Wells and Damien Cerni. Well, it worked and we ended winning pretty easily. We were set going into the Grand Final.

MAX: You had a minor hiccup on the way to the GF, didn't you? Don't go into the graphic details. but tell us what happened? Were you a chance to miss the GF?

SEAN: Yeah, I was. After the first final against Lorne, I was in the showers gathering myself, thinking about the loss and started getting a pain in mu stomach. I didn't think much of it at first, but as I was driving home with the boys, the pain was getting worse. So, we stopped off at Geelong Hospital.

They admitted me in right away and put me under and I spent the night there.

It turns out. I had testicular torsion, which was very painful, as you can imagine. I remember 'Blissy' coming in to get me the next morning. We were talking to the nurse and her just saying there's no chance I can plau footu. It was a shock, but in my head and I remember telling 'Blissu'. "I'm playing". He just said, "Look, we'll see how you're feeling". So, yeah, it's safe to say I didn't train that week, but I felt comfortable enough. With the help of my brother's skins and a bag of cotton balls, going into the game against Birre, I could get through it.



I remember shaking hands after the game and coming up to Lukey Phillips, and him basically asking me, what the hell happened? So, I pulled out some cotton balls and he didn't shake my hand after that!

MAX: The game itself was such a grind in the wet. Lorne missed some crucial shots, while you guys seemed to take your chances. Do you remember much of the game?

SEAN: Yeah I do. and like you said. it was a slog all day. Super wet and slippery. The ground was heavy and the ball was cloqged. Added to that, it was pretty windy too!

I think the conditions definitely suited us more than it did Lorne. We had the bigger bodies in the midfield and they had some big bous that could take marks. Players like Lee Holmer, Lukey Norton and others, but also skilful runners like the Smartt brothers and Stevens boys.

So, the druer conditions would have suited them more than the wet. We felt like we could play in both conditions equally as well. So, we were confident either way. But, yeah it was hard all day to get from one end to the other, and kick goals, so when you did it was crucial.

We both had a few misses. Lorne more than us, which might've cost them. For us,

Ren Hood missed a shot dead in front to seal it in the last. But. Ruan Hanlon took a pack mark and kicked it from the boundary. so it was that sort of day - a bit unpredictable.


MAX: How were the celebrations after the win? Who was MVP?

SEAN: As you can imagine the memory was pretty fuzzy over the next few days.

I know we went back to the club and the Wonku Donkeu Hotel in Forrest that night. I think we were at the club all day Sunday. We then went to the Bush Inn in Geelong on Monday and a few other pubs. as well.

I remember the Colac Imperial netball girls, who'd also won the premiership that year, had a bus driving around Geelong, and just by chance they came to a pub we were at. So, we had a few beers with them too which was nice

As far as MVP? I can't remember, as I said the memory was a bit fuzzu over those few days, but the usual suspects were there, as always my Bro and 'Matho', 'Dicko', 'Gainger', 'Big G' and 'Pippy'. I could go through and name everyone, I think as there was definitely no weak links. and it was the best few days. I'm sure in a couple months when we catch up, I'll remember much more.
