It was a cold Saturday afternoon late in June, at Red Rock and at three-quarter time, Alvie led 6.8 (44) to Irrewarra-Beeac 2.7 (19). Inspired by young Bomber Mitch 'The Bull' Thornton, who kicked four second-half goals, the Bombers kicked six goals to zip, up the hill to run out 15-point winners over their rivals.

It was to be the Swans final loss of the season, as they went on their way to claim the premiership. Meanwhile, Irrewarra-Beeac were eliminated in the preliminary final by the Colac Imperials.

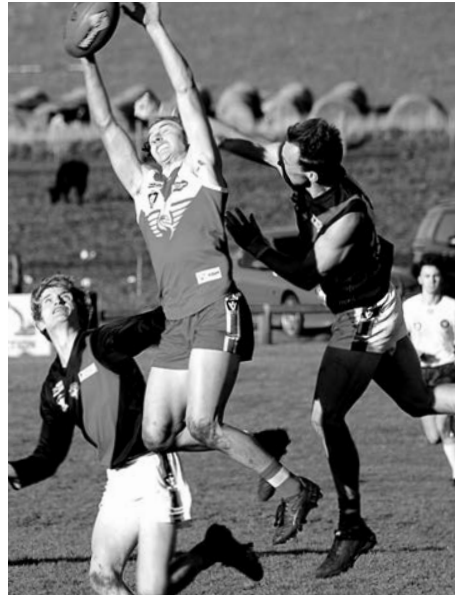

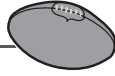
SING WHEN YOU'RE WINNING...

Opening the SEASON!

Hey, AFL! You thought *you* were pretty creative with your version of Opening Round this year. The CDFNL in recent years has led the way to open the season, with marquee matches *before* 'Round 1'. However, the games have produced mixed results, so let's take a look back.

2013 - LORNE WON ON THE SCOREBOARD, BUT LOST THE POINTS IN THE END!

Lorne 0.0 (0) 16.14 (110) *defeated* Apollo Bay 6.9 (45)

Lorne and Apollo Bay locked horns in a Coastal Cup Easter Saturday standalone season opener in 2013.

Lorne dominated the 2013 season and that's exactly how they opened the season, smashing Apollo Bay at home.

Luke Norton, who went on to win the CDFNL goalkicking award that season, kicked a lazy bag of five goals, but he also kicked six behinds.

Later that week, unfortunately for Lorne, they were stripped of their premiership points, due to playing an unregistered player.

2015 - LORNE WIN IN A CLASSIC

Lorne 13.5 (83) *defeated* Birregurra 10.15 (75)

Lorne and Birregurra opened the 2015 season on a sunny Easter Saturday afternoon in Lorne.

In a game in which the lead was exchanged multiple times, Steven Oliver kicked a late goal

with just minutes remaining to seal the match for the Dolphins.

Returning coach Jason Langdon took over during the off-season, after Lorne finished last in 2014, meanwhile Birregurra come off a Grand Final defeat the previous season.



2016 – BIRREGURRA FROM THE CLOUDS

Birregurra 10.12 (72) defeated Lorne 11.5 (71)

In an absolute classic finish to the 2016 Season Opener, **Birregurra**, who trailed by as much as 39 points at three quarter-time, produced a miracle final-quarter comeback.

The Saints stole the lead with

minutes to go, before the final siren blew, as Lorne youngster **Callum Buchanan** had a shot to win the Dolphins the game, but his kick fell short.

Birregurra would only lose one home and away game for the season, on their way to winning the 2016 flag.



2018 – BIRRE SMASH DOLPHINS IN GF RE-MATCH

Birregurra 15.17 (107) defeated Lorne 4.11 (35)

It was hyped up all during the off-season! The much anticipated Grand Final re-match showdown, between 2017 premier, Birregurra and Lorne. But, it quickly turned into a fizzer!

The Saints dominated from the get-go, completely destroying the Dolphins. Birre's **Micky Davis** dominated in the middle and kicked three goals.

The two sides would again go onto meet each other in the Grand Final - which Lorne won by 21 points.

2023 – DOM DARE, FIRST HALF BLITZ

Alvie 12.19 (81) defeated Irrewarra-Beeac 6.9 (45)

Alvie scored some early season revenge on **Irrewarra-Beeac**, after the Swans went down to the Bombers in the previous preliminary final.

Alvie's **Dom Dare** kicked six first-half goals, as the Swans cruised to an easy victory.



2021 – RETURN FROM COVID

Alvie 8.10 (58) defeated Irrewarra-Beeac 5.0 (30)

The result aside, this game was a celebration of local footy and netball returning to the Colac community after the previous 2020 season was cancelled.

Central Reserve was abuzz and, after a mini fightback from the Bombers, the Swans clicked into gear to win easily in the final term.

Will the **DOMINANCE** continue?

After a season to remember - a century goalkicker in a premiers year, **Dominic Dare** takes over as co-coach of Alvie for the first time, today. We spoke to him ahead of the 2024 season. Words - **MAX BLAKE**.



MAX BLAKE: Thanks for chatting to us, Dom. Can you believe we're entering another footy season!? How has the off-season been for you guys?

DOM DARE: The off -season has been good! We started a bit later than usual, but after the Christmas break our numbers have been really good. The boys have worked real hard. A few fresh faces has created a bit of excitement coming into the new season.

MAX: What inspired you to have a crack at senior coaching?

DOM: A new challenge. I enjoyed coaching cricket and wanted to give football coaching a go!

MAX: How have you found coaching so far? Are you enjoying it?

DOM: I'm really enjoying coaching at the moment. It's definitely different, than just

playing. I'm excited to get into the real stuff now and to see how we're tracking.

MAX: Will we see a different game plan at Alvie, compared to other years?

DOM: There's a few things myself and Shane (Quick) are trying to implement, but most things won't change too much. Potentially a few guys might play in different positions. Time will tell.

MAX: Now on to the flag. What did winning last season's premiership mean to you?

DOM: It was a great feeling! We had a list which we thought had been capable for a few years now, but fell short. It was 23 years since the last one, so it was great reward for the club and all it's volunteers.

MAX: What are your memories of the day (Grand Final)?

Do you have one moment that stuck in your memory bank?

DOM: The day went really fast! I remember starting slow, but one that sticks in my mind is when Linc (Dare) ran around the man on the mark and kicked *that* goal from 50.

MAX: Who won the MVP of the Alvie's premiership celebrations?

DOM: 100% Danny Allan!

MAX: It capped off an amazing year for you, personally. You've always be a big-time goal kicker, but to kick a ton (100) in a premiership season, must be pretty special?

DOM: It was good! I'm more about team success though. It was a pretty nice forward line to play in last season. Most of the credit goes to them - Lincoln, Seal, Carmody, Robb, Allan and Paatsch. It was good fun.



MAX: Who do you think gave you the most goal assists?

DOM: Lincoln and Micha get a lot of footy across half-forward and they always use the ball well by foot. One of those two.

MAX: You'll have a bit of competition this year for the CDFNL 'Coleman' - Jordan Eriskine and Jarrod Garth are big-time goal kickers in the Geelong area. Are you looking forward to the challenge?

DOM: Yes, I'm looking forward to seeing those guys. Obviously, both have been very good footballers. It's great for the league.

MAX: What's one big advice or pro tip you'd give to a young inspiring full-forward?

DOM: Practice goal kicking as much as you can - from all distances and angles. You might only get a couple of shots at goal on game-day.

MAX: What's your set routine for goal kicking? If you want to give that away?

Dom: Nothing special. I keep it pretty simple. Most of my shots are from the goal square.

MAX: Tell us about some of the new recruits you've signed up this season and what do you expect they'll bring to the table?

DOM: All the new guys have been great over the pre-season. Oscar Barrow and Chris Moreland have hardly missed a session. Will Paulin and Josh Onderwater will add flexibility to our side.

Ryan Mulder and Liam Loubey have also played well in practice games. We look forward to seeing them all playing this year.

MAX: What about the players returning? Who's impressed

you so far? Who looks like they might be set to have a break-out season?

DOM: A lot of guys are working hard and looking good - Harry Carmody and Lachy Mulder haven't missed a beat! ■
